PASTOR'S CORNER...Rev. John Bright

Last week we gathered for Ash Wednesday. There were many folks here to receive the ashes on their foreheads. As part of that service, I shared this "Invitation to the Observance of Lenten Discipline":

"Dear brothers and sisters in Christ: the early Christians observed with great devotion the days of our Lord's passion and resurrection, and it became the custom of the Church that before the Easter celebration there should be a forty-day season of spiritual preparation.

During this season converts to the faith were prepared for Holy Baptism. It was also a time when persons who had committed serious sins and had separated themselves from the community of faith were reconciled by penitence and forgiveness, and restored to participation in the life of the Church.

In this way the whole congregation was reminded of the mercy and forgiveness proclaimed in the gospel of Jesus Christ and the need we all have to renew our faith.

I invite you, therefore, in the name of Jesus, to observe a holy Lent: by self-examination and repentance; by prayer, fasting, and self-denial; and by reading and meditating on God's Holy Word.

To make a right beginning of repentance, and as a mark of our mortal nature, let us bow our hearts before our Creator and Redeemer." (Time for silent prayer)

Lent is our invitation from God to lay aside "the sin that so easily entangles." (Heb. 12:1) It is that season to recommit to the spiritual disciplines that have helped Believers for centuries. That's why I am focusing on prayer in my preaching/teaching all the way up to Palm Sunday (3/24). I am also starting a class on fasting from solid food that will begin on March 6th at 6:00pm. My plan is to teach for about 30 minutes and then folks who are going to bells rehearsal can leave. Others can hang out and chat for a while.

We will meet in the Genesis classroom and make it available on Zoom just like we do on Monday night Bible Study.

You may also want to consider attending a House Church that fits your schedule and/or join us on Wednesday morning at 9am for prayer and communion followed by Bible Study at 10:30am until noon. There are many open doors at Laurel Hill for you to engage in these spiritual disciplines that, as Methodists, we call "means of grace." That's a topic for another month!

My prayer – "Abba Daddy, thank you for being with the folks at Laurel Hill in this season of Lent. As we draw closer to you through the spiritual disciplines of being in your Word, prayer, and even fasting, give us the eyes to see you drawing closer to us. Let us know the intimacy with you that will move us into the path of discipleship. In Jesus' name, AMEN."


